Remember Jesus Christ, raised from the dead, a descendant of David--that is my gospel,

Μνημόνευε - 21x in NT - present active imperative 9x in NT * -remember

Matt 16:9 Do you not yet perceive? Do you not remember the five loaves of the five thousand, and how many baskets you gathered?

Mark 8:18 Having eyes do you not see, and having ears do you not hear? And do you not remember?

*Luke 17:32 Remember Lot's wife.

*John 15:20 Remember the word that I said to you, A servant is not greater than his master.' If they persecuted me, they will persecute you; if they kept my word, they will keep yours also.

John 16:4 But I have said these things to you, that when their hour comes you may remember that I told you of them. "I did not say these things to you from the beginning, because I was with you.

John 16:21 When a woman is in travail she has sorrow, because her hour has come; but when she is delivered of the child, she no longer remembers the anguish, for joy that a child is born into the world.

Acts 20:31 Therefore be alert, remembering that for three years I did not cease night or day to admonish every one with tears.

Acts 20:35 In all things I have shown you that by so toiling one must help the weak, remembering the words of the Lord Jesus, how he said, It is more

Gal 2:10 only they would have us remember the poor, which very thing I was eager to do.

*Eph 2:11 Therefore remember that at one time you Gentiles in the flesh, called the uncircumcision by what is called the circumcision, which is made in the flesh by hands --

*Col 4:18 I, Paul, write this greeting with my own hand. Remember my fetters. Grace be with you.

1Thess 1:3 remembering before our God and Father your work of faith and labor of love and steadfastness of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ.

*1Thess 2:9 For you remember our labor and toil, brethren; we worked night and day, that we might not burden any of you, while we preached to you the gospel of God.

2Thess 2:5 Do you not remember that when I was still with you I told you this?

*2Tim 2:8 Remember Jesus Christ, risen from the dead, descended from David, as preached in my gospel,

Heb 11:15 If they had been thinking of that land from which they had gone out, they would have had opportunity to return.

Heb 11:22 By faith Joseph, at the end of his life, made mention of the exodus of the Israelites and gave directions concerning his burial.

*Heb 13:7 Remember your leaders, those who spoke to you the word of God; consider the outcome of their life, and imitate their faith.

*Rev 2:5 Remember then from what you have fallen, repent and do the works you did at first. If not, I will come to you and remove your lampstand from its place, unless you repent.

*Rev 3:3 Remember then what you received and heard; keep that, and repent. If you will not awake, I will come like a thief, and you will not know at what hour I will come upon you.

Rev 18:5 for her sins are heaped high as heaven, and God has remembered her iniquities.

ἐγγεννημένον - 144x in NT, 44x in Paul {of which 20x are in 1Corinthians!} - perfect passive participle 2x in NT * - *to cause to stand up, with a possible implication of some previous incapacity - to get up, normally from a lying or reclining position but possibly from a seated position (in some contexts with the implication of some degree of previous incapacity) - to cause someone to awaken - to cause to come into existence - to cause someone to live again after having once died - to change to a previous good state - (a figurative extension of ἐγείρω to cause to stand up) to restore a person to health and vigor (somewhat equivalent to the English idiom 'to get him on his feet again')* -

*Mark 16:14 Afterward he appeared to the eleven themselves as they sat at table; and he upbraided them for their unbelief and hardness of heart, because they had not believed those who saw him after he had risen.

*2Tim 2:8 Remember Jesus Christ, risen from the dead, descended from David, as preached in my gospel,

Romans 4:24 but for ours also. It will be reckoned to us who believe in him that raised from the dead Jesus our Lord,

Romans 4:25 who was put to death for our trespasses and raised for our justification.

Romans 6:4 We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life.

Romans 6:9 For we know that Christ being raised from the dead will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him.

Romans 7:4 Likewise, my brethren, you have died to the law through the body of Christ, so that you may belong to another, to him who has been raised from the dead in order that we may bear fruit for God.

Romans 8:11 [2x] If the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, he who raised Christ Jesus from the dead will give life to your mortal bodies also through his Spirit which dwells in you.

Romans 8:34 who is to condemn? Is it Christ Jesus, who died, yes, who was raised from the dead, who is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us?

Romans 10:9 because, if you confess with your lips that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved.

Romans 13:11 Besides this you know what hour it is, how it is full time now for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we first believed;

1Cor 6:14 And God raised the Lord and will also raise us up by his power.

2Cor 1:9 Why, we felt that we had received the sentence of death; but that was to make us rely not on ourselves but on God who raises the dead;

2Cor 4:14 [2x] knowing that he who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus and bring us with you into his presence.

2Cor 5:15 And he died for all, that those who live might live no longer for themselves but for him who for their sake died and was raised.

Gal 1:1 Paul an apostle -- not from men nor through man, but through Jesus Christ and God the Father, who raised him from the dead --

Eph 1:20 which he accomplished in Christ when he raised him from the dead and made him sit at his right hand in the heavenly places,

Eph 5:14 Therefore it is said, "Awake, O sleeper, and arise from the dead, and Christ shall give you light."

Phil 1:17 the former proclaim Christ out of partisanship, not sincerely but thinking to afflict me in my imprisonment.

Col 2:12 and you were buried with him in baptism, in which you were also raised with him through faith in the working of God, who raised him from the dead.

1Thess 1:10 and to wait for his Son from heaven, whom he raised from the dead, Jesus who delivers us from the wrath to come.

2Tim 2:8 Remember Jesus Christ, risen from the dead, descended from David, as preached in my gospel,

ἐγγερμένον ἐκ νεκρῶν - 12x in NT [verb, any case] - [here, perfect passive participle, NT Hapax] - *risen from the dead* -

Mark 6:14 King Herod heard of it; for Jesus' name had become known. Some said, "John the baptizer has been raised from the dead; that is why these powers are at work in him."

Luke 9:7 Now Herod the tetrarch heard of all that was done, and he was perplexed, because it was said by some that John had been raised from the dead,

John 2:22 When therefore he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this; and they believed the scripture and the word which Jesus had spoken.

John 12:1 Six days before the Passover, Jesus came to Bethany, where Laz'arus was, whom Jesus had raised from the dead.

John 12:9 When the great crowd of the Jews learned that he was there, they came, not only on account of Jesus but also to see Laz'arus, whom he had raised from the dead.

John 21:14 This was now the third time that Jesus was revealed to the disciples after he was raised from the dead.

Acts 3:15 and killed the Author of life, whom God raised from the dead. To this we are witnesses.

Acts 4:10 be it known to you all, and to all the people of Israel, that by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead, by him this man is standing before you well.

Romans 6:9 For we know that Christ being raised from the dead will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him.

Romans 10:9 because, if you confess with your lips that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved.

ἐκ νεκρῶν - 44x in NT, 17x in Paul - *from death*

Romans 4:24 but for ours also. It will be reckoned to us who believe in him that raised from the dead Jesus our Lord,

Romans 6:4 We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life.

Romans 6:9 For we know that Christ being raised from the dead will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him.

Romans 6:13 Do not yield your members to sin as instruments of wickedness, but yield yourselves to God as men who have been brought from death to life, and your members to God as instruments of righteousness.

Romans 7:4 Likewise, my brethren, you have died to the law through the body of Christ, so that you may belong to another, to him who has been raised from the dead in order that we may bear fruit for God.

Gal 1:1 Paul an apostle -- not from men nor through man, but through Jesus Christ and God the Father, who raised him from the dead --

Eph 1:20 which he accomplished in Christ when he raised him from the dead and made him sit at his right hand in the heavenly places,

Phil 3:11 that if possible I may attain the resurrection from the dead.

Col 2:12 and you were buried with him in baptism, in which you were also raised with him through faith in the working of God, who raised him from the dead.

2Tim 2:8 Remember Jesus Christ, risen from the dead, descended from David, as preached in my gospel,

ἐκ σπέρματος - 3x in NT -

Romans 1:3 the gospel concerning his Son, who was descended from David according to the flesh

Romans 11:1 I ask, then, has God rejected his people? By no means! I myself am an Israelite, a descendant of Abraham, a member of the tribe of Benjamin.

2Tim 2:8 Remember Jesus Christ, risen from the dead, descended from David, as preached in my gospel,

ἐκ σπέρματος Δαυίδ - 2x in NT, see above

κατὰ τὸ εὐαγγέλιον - 4x in NT - *according to the Gospel* -

Romans 2:16 on that day when, according to my gospel, God judges the secrets of men by Christ Jesus.

Romans 16:25 Now to him who is able to strengthen you according to my gospel and the preaching of Jesus Christ, according to the revelation of the mystery which was kept secret for long ages

1Tim 1:11 in accordance with the glorious gospel of the blessed God with which I have been entrusted.

2Tim 2:8 Remember Jesus Christ, risen from the dead, descended from David, as preached in my gospel,

2:9

ἐν ᾧ κακοπαθῶ μέχρι δεσμῶν ὡς κακούργος, ἀλλὰ ὁ λόγος τοῦ θεοῦ οὐ δέδεταί·

for which I suffer hardship, even to the point of being chained like a criminal. But the word of God is not chained.

κακοπαθῶ - 3x in NT - *o suffer physical pain, hardship and distress* -

2Tim 2:9 the gospel for which I am suffering and wearing fetters like a criminal. But the word of God is not fettered.

2Tim 4:5 As for you, always be steady, endure suffering, do the work of an evangelist, fulfil your ministry.

James 5:13 Is any one among you suffering? Let him pray. Is any cheerful? Let him sing praise.

μέχρι - 17x in NT, 8x in Paul - *until*

Romans 5:14 Yet death reigned from Adam to Moses, even over those whose sins were not like the transgression of Adam, who was a type of the one who was to come.

Romans 15:19 by the power of signs and wonders, by the power of the Holy Spirit, so that from Jerusalem and as far round as Illyricum I have fully preached the gospel of Christ,

Gal 4:19 My little children, with whom I am again in travail until Christ be formed in you!

Eph 4:13 until we all attain to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to mature manhood, to the measure of the stature of the fulness of Christ;

Phil 2:8 And being found in human form he humbled himself and became obedient unto death, even death on a cross.

Phil 2:30 for he nearly died for the work of Christ, risking his life to complete your service to me.

1Tim 6:14 I charge you to keep the commandment unstained and free from reproach until the appearing of our Lord Jesus Christ;

2Tim 2:9 the gospel for which I am suffering and wearing fetters like a criminal. But the word of God is not fettered.

δεσμῶν - 18x in NT, 8x in Paul - *any instrument or means of binding or tying - the state of being in prison - a state of physical incapacity or illness, usually as the result of some controlling supernatural force (in Lk 13.16, the result of the activity of Satan)*

Phil 1:7 It is right for me to feel thus about you all, because I hold you in my heart, for you are all partakers with me of grace, both in my imprisonment and in the defense and confirmation of the gospel.

Phil 1:13 so that it has become known throughout the whole praetorian guard and to all the rest that my imprisonment is for Christ;

Phil 1:14 and most of the brethren have been made confident in the Lord because of my imprisonment, and are much more bold

to speak the word of God without fear.

Phil 1:17 the former proclaim Christ out of partisanship, not sincerely but thinking to afflict me in my imprisonment.

Col 4:18 I, Paul, write this greeting with my own hand. Remember my fetters. Grace be with you.

2Tim 2:9 the gospel for which I am suffering and wearing fetters like a criminal. But the word of God is not fettered.

Philem 1:10 I appeal to you for my child, Onesimus, whose father I have become in my imprisonment.

Philem 1:13 I would have been glad to keep him with me, in order that he might serve me on your behalf during my imprisonment for the gospel;

κακοῦργος - 4x in NT - *one who customarily engages in doing what is bad* -

Luke 23:32 Two others also, who were criminals, were led away to be put to death with him.

Luke 23:33 And when they came to the place which is called The Skull, there they crucified him, and the criminals, one on the right and one on the left.

Luke 23:39 One of the criminals who were hanged railed at him, saying, "Are you not the Christ? Save yourself and us!"

2Tim 2:9 the gospel for which I am suffering and wearing fetters like a criminal. But the word of God is not fettered.

ὁ λόγος τοῦ θεοῦ - [nom] 11x in NT * - any case, 33x in NT, 7x in Paul - *the Word of God*

*Luke 8:11 Now the parable is this: The seed is the word of God.

*John 10:35 If he called them gods to whom the word of God came (and scripture cannot be broken),

*Acts 6:7 And the word of God increased; and the number of the disciples multiplied greatly in Jerusalem, and a great many of the priests were obedient to the faith.

*Acts 17:13 But when the Jews of Thessalonica learned that the word of God was proclaimed by Paul at Berea also, they came there too, stirring up and inciting the crowds.

*Romans 9:6 But it is not as though the word of God had failed. For not all who are descended from Israel belong to Israel,

*1Cor 14:36 What! Did the word of God originate with you, or are you the only ones it has reached?

2Cor 2:17 For we are not, like so many, peddlers of God's word; but as men of sincerity, as commissioned by God, in the sight of God we speak in Christ.

2Cor 4:2 We have renounced disgraceful, underhanded ways; we refuse to practice cunning or to tamper with God's word, but by the open statement of the truth we would commend ourselves to every man's conscience in the sight of God.

Col 1:25 of which I became a minister according to the divine office which was given to me for you, to make the word of God fully known,

*2Tim 2:9 the gospel for which I am suffering and wearing fetters like a criminal. But the word of God is not fettered.

*Titus 2:5 to be sensible, chaste, domestic, kind, and submissive to their husbands, that the word of God may not be discredited.

*Heb 4:12 For the word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing to the division of soul and spirit, of joints and marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart.

*1John 2:14 I write to you, fathers, because you know him who is from the beginning. I write to you, young men, because you are strong, and the word of God abides in you, and you have overcome the evil one.

*Rev 19:13 He is clad in a robe dipped in blood, and the name by which he is called is The Word of God.

δέδεταί - 45x in NT, 5x in Paul - *I. to bind, tie, 2. metaph. to bind, enchain 3. c. gen. to let or stop one from a thing, II. Mid. to bind, tie, put on oneself*

Romans 7:2 Thus a married woman is bound by law to her husband as long as he lives; but if her husband dies she is discharged from the law concerning the husband.

1Cor 7:27 Are you bound to a wife? Do not seek to be free. Are you free from a wife? Do not seek marriage.

1Cor 7:39 A wife is bound to her husband as long as he lives. If the husband dies, she is free to be married to whom she wishes, only in the Lord.

Col 4:3 and pray for us also, that God may open to us a door for the word, to declare the mystery of Christ, on account of which I am in prison,

2Tim 2:9 the gospel for which I am suffering and wearing fetters like a criminal. But the word of God is not fettered.

διὰ τοῦτο πάντα ὑπομένω διὰ τοὺς ἐκλεκτούς, ἵνα καὶ αὐτοὶ σωτηρίας τύχωσιν τῆς ἐν Χριστῷ Ἰησοῦ μετὰ δόξης αἰωνίου.

Therefore I endure everything for the sake of the elect, so that they may also obtain the salvation that is in Christ Jesus, with eternal glory.

ὑπομένω - 17x in NT - *to resist by holding one's ground - to stay longer in a place than one is expected to - to continue in an activity or state despite resistance and opposition - to continue to bear up despite difficulty and suffering -*

Matt 10:22 and you will be hated by all for my name's sake. But he who endures to the end will be saved.

Matt 24:13 But he who endures to the end will be saved.

Mark 13:13 and you will be hated by all for my name's sake. But he who endures to the end will be saved.

Luke 2:43 and when the feast was ended, as they were returning, the boy Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem. His parents did not know it,

Acts 17:14 Then the brethren immediately sent Paul off on his way to the sea, but Silas and Timothy remained there.

Romans 12:12 Rejoice in your hope, be patient in tribulation, be constant in prayer.

1Cor 13:7 Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.

2Tim 2:10 Therefore I endure everything for the sake of the elect, that they also may obtain salvation in Christ Jesus with its eternal glory.

2Tim 2:12 if we endure, we shall also reign with him; if we deny him, he also will deny us;

Heb 10:32 But recall the former days when, after you were enlightened, you endured a hard struggle with sufferings,

Heb 12:2 looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God.

Heb 12:3 Consider him who endured from sinners such hostility against himself, so that you may not grow weary or fainthearted.

Heb 12:7 It is for discipline that you have to endure. God is treating you as sons; for what son is there whom his father does not discipline?

James 1:12 Blessed is the man who endures trial, for when he has stood the test he will receive the crown of life which God has promised to those who love him.

James 5:11 Behold, we call those happy who were steadfast. You have heard of the steadfastness of Job, and you have seen the purpose of the Lord, how the Lord is compassionate and merciful.

1Peter 2:20 [2x] For what credit is it, if when you do wrong and are beaten for it you take it patiently? But if when you do right and suffer for it you take it patiently, you have God's approval.

διὰ τοῦς ἐκλεκτοῦς - 2x in NT - *for the sake of the elect*

Mark 13:20 And if the Lord had not shortened the days, no human being would be saved; but for the sake of the elect, whom he chose, he shortened the days.

2Tim 2:10 Therefore I endure everything for the sake of the elect, that they also may obtain salvation in Christ Jesus with its eternal glory.

ἐκλεκτοῦς - 22x in NT - *that which has been chosen* -

Matt 22:14 For many are called, but few are chosen."

Matt 24:22 And if those days had not been shortened, no human being would be saved; but for the sake of the elect those days will be shortened.

Matt 24:24 For false Christs and false prophets will arise and show great signs and wonders, so as to lead astray, if possible, even the elect.

Matt 24:31 and he will send out his angels with a loud trumpet call, and they will gather his elect from the four winds, from one end of heaven to the other.

Mark 13:20 And if the Lord had not shortened the days, no human being would be saved; but for the sake of the elect, whom he chose, he shortened the days.

Mark 13:22 False Christs and false prophets will arise and show signs and wonders, to lead astray, if possible, the elect.

Mark 13:27 And then he will send out the angels, and gather his elect from the four winds, from the ends of the earth to the ends of heaven.

Luke 18:7 And will not God vindicate his elect, who cry to him day and night? Will he delay long over them?

Luke 23:35 And the people stood by, watching; but the rulers scoffed at him, saying, "He saved others; let him save himself, if he is the Christ of God, his Chosen One!"

Romans 8:33 Who shall bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies;

Romans 16:13 Greet Rufus, eminent in the Lord, also his mother and mine.

Col 3:12 Put on then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, compassion, kindness, lowliness, meekness, and patience,

1Tim 5:21 In the presence of God and of Christ Jesus and of the elect angels I charge you to keep these rules without favor, doing nothing from partiality.

2Tim 2:10 Therefore I endure everything for the sake of the elect, that they also may obtain salvation in Christ Jesus with its eternal glory.

Titus 1:1 Paul, a servant of God and an apostle of Jesus Christ, to further the faith of God's elect and their knowledge of the truth which accords with godliness,

1Peter 1:1 Peter, an apostle of Jesus Christ, To the exiles of the Dispersion in Pontus, Galatia, Cappado'cia, Asia, and Bithyn'ia,

1Peter 2:4 Come to him, to that living stone, rejected by men but in God's sight chosen and precious;

1Peter 2:6 For it stands in scripture: "Behold, I am laying in Zion a stone, a cornerstone chosen and precious, and he who believes in him will not be put to shame."

1Peter 2:9 But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, that you may declare the wonderful deeds of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light.

2John 1:1 The elder to the elect lady and her children, whom I love in the truth, and not only I but also all who know the truth

2John 1:13 The children of your elect sister greet you.

Rev 17:14 they will make war on the Lamb, and the Lamb will conquer them, for he is Lord of lords and King of kings, and those with him are called and chosen and faithful."

σωτηρίας - 46x in NT, 16x in Paul - *to rescue from danger and to restore to a former state of safety and well being - a state of having been saved - the process of being saved* -

Romans 1:16 For I am not ashamed of the gospel: it is the power of God for salvation to every one who has faith, to the Jew first and also to the Greek.

Romans 10:1 Brethren, my heart's desire and prayer to God for them is that they may be saved.

Romans 10:10 For man believes with his heart and so is justified, and he confesses with his lips and so is saved.

Romans 11:11 So I ask, have they stumbled so as to fall? By no means! But through their trespass salvation has come to the Gentiles, so as to make Israel jealous.

Romans 13:11 Besides this you know what hour it is, how it is full time now for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we first believed;

2Cor 1:6 If we are afflicted, it is for your comfort and salvation; and if we are comforted, it is for your comfort, which you experience when you patiently endure the same sufferings that we suffer.

2Cor 6:2 [2x] For he says, "At the acceptable time I have listened to you, and helped you on the day of salvation." Behold, now is the acceptable time; behold, now is the day of salvation.

2Cor 7:10 For godly grief produces a repentance that leads to salvation and brings no regret, but worldly grief produces death.

Eph 1:13 In him you also, who have heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and have believed in him, were sealed with the promised Holy Spirit,

Phil 1:19 Yes, and I shall rejoice. For I know that through your prayers and the help of the Spirit of Jesus Christ this will turn out for my deliverance,

Phil 1:28 and not frightened in anything by your opponents. This is a clear omen to them of their destruction, but of your salvation, and that from God.

Phil 2:12 Therefore, my beloved, as you have always obeyed, so now, not only as in my presence but much more in my absence, work out your own salvation with fear and trembling;

1Thess 5:8 But, since we belong to the day, let us be sober, and put on the breastplate of faith and love, and for a helmet the hope of salvation.

1Thess 5:9 For God has not destined us for wrath, but to obtain salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ,

2Thess 2:13 But we are bound to give thanks to God always for you, brethren beloved by the Lord, because God chose you from the beginning to be saved, through sanctification by the Spirit and belief in the truth.

2Tim 2:10 Therefore I endure everything for the sake of the elect, that they also may obtain salvation in Christ Jesus with its eternal glory.
