Exegetical Notes on John 21:1-14

As I read this text, I marvel at how this ties in so many previous texts from John, particularly in the passion and resurection period by means of the careful use of words. It thus becomes very important to remember when was the last time John used the word, as it may give considerable insight to what is going on in our text. This gospel has long been noted as an early master of the use of irony.
