- 6:18 and, having been set free from sin, have become slaves of righteousness.

- 6:22 But now that you have been set free from sin and have become slaves of God, the return you get is sanctification and its end, eternal life.
- 6:23 For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

άχρι - 4x in Romans - the continuous extent of time up to a point - a point of time which is subsequent to a duration and simultaneous with another point of time - extension up to or as far as a goal -

1:13 I want you to know, brethren, that I have often intended to come to you (but thus far have been prevented), in order that I may reap some harvest among you as well as among the rest of the Gentiles.

5:13 sin indeed was in the world before the law was given, but sin is not counted where there is no law.

8:22 We know that the whole creation has been groaning in travail together until now;

11:25 Lest you be wise in your own conceits, I want you to understand this mystery, brethren: a hardening has come upon part of Israel, until the full number of the Gentiles come in,

ἄχρι νόμου - NT Hapax

νόμου - 74x in Romans - a formalized rule (or set of rules) prescribing what people must do -the first five books of the OT called the Torah (often better rendered as `instruction') - the sacred writings of the OT -

2:12 [2x] All who have sinned without the law will also perish without the law, and all who have sinned under the law will be judged by the law.

2:13 [2x] For it is not the hearers of the law who are righteous before God, but the doers of the law who will be justified.

2:14 [4x] When Gentiles who have not the law do by nature what the law requires, they are a law to themselves, even though they do not have the law.

2:15 They show that what the law requires is written on their hearts, while their conscience also bears witness and their conflicting thoughts accuse or perhaps excuse them

- 2:17 But if you call yourself a Jew and rely upon the law and boast of

1Cor 14:10 There are doubtless many different languages in the world, and none is without meaning;

Phil 2:15 that you may be blameless and innocent, children of God without blemish in the midst of a crooked and perverse generation, among whom you shine as lights in the world,

Col 2:20 If with Christ you died to the elemental spirits of the universe, why do you live as if you still belonged to the world? Why do you submit to regulations,

1Tim 3:16 Great indeed, we confess, is the mystery of our religion: He was manifested in the flesh, vindicated in the Spirit, seen by angels, preached among the nations, believed on in the world, taken up in glory.

ελλογείται - 2x in NT -here, a present passive inidicative - to keep a record of something -to charge to an account -

Romans 5:13 sin indeed was in the world before the law was given, but sin is not counted where there is no law.

Romans 5:17 [2x] If, because of one man's trespass, death reigned through that one man, much more will those who receive the abundance of grace and the free gift of righteousness reign in life through the one man Jesus Christ.

Romans 5:21 [2x] so that, as sin reigned in death, grace also might reign through righteousness to eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.
